# St. Brigid/Our Lady of Hope Catholic School





My reason for

We asked members of our school community to share their experience at our incredible Catholic School... their reasons for HOPE.

Our teams have had great success at the Diocesan Aquinas Expo. Aquinas is a yearlong self-guided learning experience that transcends the four walls of the classroom. Student participants seek to answer an essential question created by the team. Last year, one of our teams researched food insecurity as part of their study of homelessness. As part of their solution, they came up with the idea for a community fridge. They proposed to put a refrigerator outside of the Parish Outreach building on Post Avenue and then stock it with take away meals. They got a refrigerator donated and painted it. The group presented at the Aquinas Expo in April and received two of the top awards for their research and presentation. Fast forward to this school year. The fridge has been installed on the back porch of the Outreach building. Members of this year's Aquinas group have been preparing meals weekly for the fridge. The need has been greater than we anticipated. Upwards of 100 meals are being provided each week. Our Pastor, Father John, and the Outreach Directors realized that this needed to be opened up to Parishioners to help prepare meals. This school project has become a full fledged part of Parish Social Ministry. The ministry has been christened, San Lorenzo's Lunch Box. (San Lorenzo is the Patron Saint of cooks and bakers.) Most of the team graduated in June, but the legacy of their work continues in the School and Parish. We couldn't be prouder!






