REJOICING IN THE LORD MUST BE YOUR STRENGTH

The priest-scribe Ezra proclaims the law of Moses to the Jewish people who had returned from exile in Babylon. Upon hearing the words of the law for the first time in a generation, the people weep. Their sorrow at not having adhered to the law for so long should call attention to our own infidelities to God's law. But most of all, this people's wholehearted response to the law can fill us with gratitude to God for revealing His merciful love to us in Jesus Christ.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Ezra the priest-scribe reads from the book of the law, interpreting so that all could understand. He enjoins them, *Today is holy to the Lord your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep.* In the second reading, Paul writes that, in Christ, all are one body. Each part of the body has a purpose to fulfill. In the Gospel, Jesus returns to Nazareth. There He reads in the synagogue and announces that the passage is fulfilled in their hearing.

REST IN PEACE, REV. MSGR DONALD HANSON

September 19, 1945-January 17, 2025

Our good friend and resident retired priest, Rev. Msgr. Donald M. Hanson, has died and gone home to God. He became a special part of our parish and loved dearly. His passing is profound and sorrowful.

His sermons, prayers, and teachings, along with his kindness and good humor, will leave us with meaningful and fond memories. We celebrate his life and the influence he had an all of us.

Rev. Msgr. Donald Hanson was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, NY on May 29, 1971. He was named a Chaplain of His Holiness on December 10, 2004. He served as Associate Pastor of Our Lady of Loretto Hempstead, St. Agnes Rockville Centre and St. Margaret of Scotland Selden. He served as Director at Office of Catechesis and Worship. Msgr. Donald Hanson was appointed Vice Rector of the American College of the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium, where American seminarians studied philosophy and theology. He was fluent in Dutch and French. He served as Pastor of St. Joseph Babylon, Our Lady of Hope Carle Place and Most Holy Trinity East Hampton. Msgr. Hanson was in residence at St. Louis de Montfort Sound Beach, where he continued to serve in retirement.

Msgr. Hanson's wake, Vigil Mass and funeral were all held at St. Louis de Montfort in Sound Beach.




